

Proclamation

From the Mayor of Haslet, Texas



Declaring a Moment of Honor at 3:25 p.m. on March 25th to remember and honor recipients of the Medal of Honor.

WHEREAS, the Medal of Honor is the highest award for valor in combat awarded across all branches of the United States military, and

WHEREAS, President Abraham Lincoln signed legislation from congress creating the Medal of Honor in 1861 with the first medal being awarded in 1863, and

WHEREAS, Approximately thirty-five hundred individuals, eighty-six of whom are laid to rest in the great State of Texas, have received this highest honor, and

WHEREAS, Our country has celebrated National Medal of Honor Day on March 25th since the holiday was first created by Congress in 1990 and signed into law by President George HW Bush, and

WHEREAS, Texans are deeply patriotic and have a strong history of supporting the men and women of the Armed Forces, and

WHEREAS, The National Medal of Honor Museum Foundation has selected Texas as the official home for the National Medal of Honor Museum,

BE IT RESOLVED THAT, I, Mayor Bob Golden with the City Council of the City of Haslet, Texas declare a Moment of Honor to be held at 3:25 p.m. on Medal of Honor Day, March 25th as a time for all our citizens to remember those past and honor those living recipients of the Medal of Honor.
