HONORING EVERYDAY AMERICANS WHO BECAME LEGENDARY HEROES

In 1863, President Abraham Lincoln designated the Medal of Honor as the nation's highest military medal for valor in combat. Since that time, the Medal of Honor has been earned by 3,493 recipients over its 160-year history, adding to Lincoln's legacy—and the legacy of the “ordinary” Americans who continue to inspire us to go above and beyond the call of duty.

In conjunction with the National Medal of Honor Museum and National Medal of Honor Institute in Arlington, Texas, the Medal of Honor Monument is a remarkable opportunity to recognize every branch of the military, every battle since the Civil War, every state in the union, every generation since 1863, and Americans from every walk of life with a single monument.
