About the Institute, Museum, and Monument: *The National Medal of Honor Griffin Institute, Museum, and Monument will inspire individuals by honoring and preserving the history of the highest military decoration awarded for valor in combat.*

Through dynamic and far-reaching programming, the National Medal of Honor Griffin Institute will bring to life the core values inherent to the Medal of Honor. Character curriculum is already being delivered in 29,000 schools around the country and multi-day courses for current and rising adult leaders have taken place twice in 2023 with three such courses planned for 2024. Programming from the Griffin Institute will reach classrooms, boardrooms, and communities around the country.

The Museum will serve as a national landmark located in America's heartland in Arlington, Texas – the Museum will provide an unrivaled visitor experience and illustrate the historical thread of sacrifice, patriotism and courage that runs through all U.S. military service members, past and present. Beyond its state-of-the-art, interactive experiences, a critical part of the Museum's mission will be to use the stories of Medal of Honor recipients to inspire their fellow Americans and motivate them to be their best selves.

A National Monument in Washington, D.C., will commemorate the service and sacrifice of the bravest and most decorated members of the U.S. Armed Forces. To be located in the nation's capital, it will give all Americans the opportunity to reflect on the courage and patriotism that safeguard freedom and democracy.
